Memorial Day, originally called **Decoration Day**, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. There are many stories as to its actual beginnings, with over two dozen cities and towns laying claim to being the birthplace of Memorial Day. There is also evidence that organized women's groups in the South were decorating graves before the end of the Civil War: a hymn published in 1867, "Kneel Where Our Loves are Sleeping" by Nella L. Sweet carried the dedication "To The Ladies of the South who are Decorating the Graves of the Confederate Dead" (Source: Duke University's Historic American Sheet Music, 1850-1920). While Waterloo N.Y. was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966, it's difficult to prove conclusively the origins of the day. It is more likely that it had many separate beginnings.

Memorial Day was officially proclaimed on 5 May 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, in his *General Order No. 11*, and was first observed on 30 May 1868, when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. The South refused to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war). It is now celebrated in almost every State on the last Monday in May (passed by Congress in 1968 to ensure a three day weekend for Federal holidays), though several southern states have an additional, separate day for honoring the Confederate war dead: January 19 in Texas, April 26 in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and Mississippi; May 10 in South Carolina; and June 3 (Jefferson Davis' birthday) in Louisiana and Tennessee.

In 1915, inspired by the poem "In Flanders Fields," Moira Michael replied with her own poem:

*We cherish too, the Poppy red
That grows on fields where valor led,
It seems to signal to the skies
That blood of heroes never dies.*

Orven H. (Doggie) Gann

Funeral services for **Orven H. (Doggie) Gann** were held at 10:00 AM March 31 at Christian-Gavlik Funeral Home on West Broadway in Broken Arrow, OK; Leon Dashner will officiate.

Mr. Gann was born 23 November 1916 in Coweta, Wagoner County, Oklahoma to **Edward Isom Gann** and **Bertha Elma Peele**. Mr. Gann died in Broken Arrow March 27. He was a steam fitter. He was preceded in death by his parents, sisters; **Lelia Viola Gann**, **Letha Arzona Morton**, **Lena Etolia Rosser**, **Florene Ragsdale** and **Jeanette Forbes**; a brother **Harlan Raymond (Rabbit) Gann**. He is survived by a son **Chris Gann** of Houston, Texas; daughters **Angelia Seyler** and her husband **Roger** of Forsyth, MO and **Robyn Murphy** and her husband **Fred** of Broken Arrow; a sister, **Lorene Stephens** of Sapulpa; six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Memories of Doggie Gann, from Charlie Gann:

My Uncle, Orven H. (Doggie) Gann was a very nice man. That isn't just from a bragging nephew. Next to my father he was a large influence in my life. I never knew his real name until I was in the Navy and saw an item about **Orven Gann** buying the Skelly station in Broken Arrow for the second time. I then knew his first name. The H. stands for Hugh. I didn't find that out until after I got out of the Navy. My father's name was **Harlan Raymond (Rabbit) Gann**. Dad was two years older than Uncle Doggie and when they were young, Uncle Doggie was always following Dad. One of the men said, "*There goes the Gann boys, Orven after Harlan, just like a dog chasing a rabbit.*" Those names stuck.

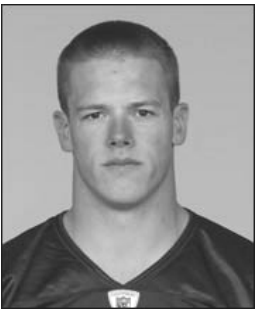
One more story about the nicknames: We lived in Coweta, Oklahoma until 1951. Dad and Doggie were born there and for the most part lived there until then. Everyone knew them as Rabbit and Doggie and like me, didn't know their real names. In 1940, Mom needed some items for the babies, Brother Bill and me, but they had no money. Dad was working at a service station and would get paid the next day. He told Mom he would make arrangements with Joe Florence, an old time grocery store owner, to charge what Mom needed. Mom dressed us up, went to the store and got the necessary items. When she was checking out she told Mr. Florence to charge it to Harlan Gann. Joe said, "*I don't know any Harlan Gann.*" Fortunately for

Mom there was a person in the store that knew the boys and told Joe, "That was Rabbit". Joe replied to Mom, "Oh yes, Mrs. Rabbit, he was in here this morning." He then wrote out the charge ticket. To the best of my knowledge, Joe Florence never called Mom, "Edith"; it was always "Mrs. Rabbit".

The Chargers secured an outstanding young tight end with the selection of Oregon's **Justin Peelle** in the fourth round of the 2002 NFL Draft with the 103rd overall choice.

Peelle continued Oregon's long line of standout tight ends who have been integral parts of the Ducks' offense. He possesses good size and speed, which allowed him to be a major factor in the Ducks' passing and running games. He was a master at understanding the squad's offense and it aided his ability to find seams in the opponent's secondary.

Peelle was a four-time All-Pac-10 Conference Academic Team selection who overcame injury problems early in his career to leave the Eugene, Oregon campus with 63 receptions for 944 yards (15.1 avg.) and 14 touchdowns while appearing in 42 contests.

Born **Justin Morris Peelle** on March 15, 1979 in Fresno, California, he was three-year starter and first-team All-Tri County Athletic League offensive and defensive choice at Dublin High School in Dublin, CA. He also earned first-team All-Alameda County recognition from Tri-Valley Herald.

His family includes a brother and a sister and he now lives with his mother and **stepfather** Stephen and Bonnie Remers

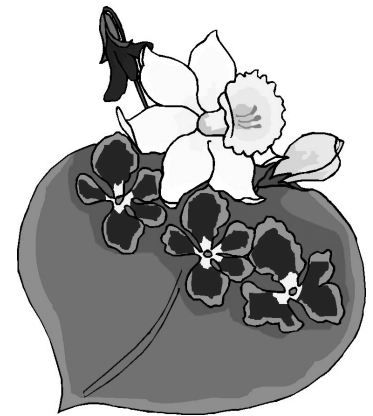

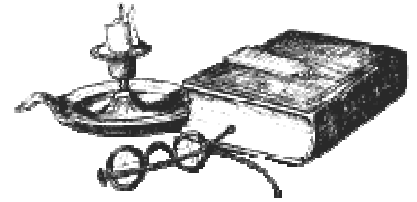

Application having been this day made to admit to Probate the Last Will and Testament of **William Peelle** late of Clinton County Ohio deceased. It is ordered that notice by notice issued out of this court be given of said application to the widow and next of kin of the testator resident in this State at least five days before the time of hearing thereof which time of hearing is fixed for Thursday the 27th day of September 1883 at 2 O'clock P. M. to which time this matter is continued.

Notice of the time of hearing of this application having been given as heretofore ordered by the Court to the widow and next of kin of the testator resident in the State of Ohio and the same now coming on to be heard. Thereupon said Will was duly proved by the oaths of **Mark Peelle** and **Enos P. Peelle** subscribing witnesses thereto who were duly sworn and examined in open Court and their testimony reduced to writing and by them respectively subscribed and filed. And it appearing to the Court from the testimony of said witnesses that such Will was duly attested and executed and that the testator at the time of executing the same was of full age and of sound mind and memory and not under any restraint. It is now here ordered that said will be admitted to Probate and filed and that the same together with the testimony so taken and reduced to writing as aforesaid be recorded.

Know all men by these present that I **William Peelle** of the County of Clinton and State of Ohio do hereby give devise and bequeath my estate real and personal as follows hereby revoking all former wills.

First: After settling all my just debts my will and desire is that my beloved wife **Louisa H. Peelle** shall have the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) to be paid to her in seven (7) equal annual payments.

The remainder of my estate to be divided as follows: to my son **John Peelle** one thousand dollars, to my son **Isaiah Peelle** one thousand dollars, to my son **Jesse Peelle** one thousand dollars, to the estate of son **Wilson Peelle** deceased, one thousand dollars. Each of these four bequests to my sons to be less the amount of their several promissory notes held by me, i.e., **John Peelle** five hundred dollars, **Isaiah Peelle** two hundred and fifty dollars, **Jesse Peelle** two hundred dollars and to the estate of **Wilson Peelle** one hundred dollars. To my son, **Reuben Peelle**, one thousand five hundred dollars. To my daughter **Louisa Moon** five dollars she having previously received a full share of my estate in land and other property for which she gave me a receipt in full.

I further give to **Nat Hanly** the sum of one hundred dollars and to *Grassy Run Meeting of the Society of Friends* the sum of thirty dollars per year for twenty years to be used for general church purposes.

If there remain sufficient means from my estate after paying the above mentioned items, I will and desire that the sum of two hundred dollars shall be paid into the endowment fund of **Wilmington College** to aid in paying the tuition of poor worthy children.

And further I will and desire that if anything remain of my estate real and personal after paying all of the above mentioned items it shall be divided into seven equal parts, one for my wife **Louise H. Peelle** and one to each of my six children. I will and desire that all of the items of this will except that to my wife **Louisa H. Peelle** shall be paid in three equal annual payments.

I hereby nominate and appoint my sons, **John Peelle** and **Reuben Peelle** executor of this my last Will and Testament.

I will and desire that the contract existing between myself and my son **Reuben Peelle** be cancelled 3rd mo. 1st 1884 and my estate be settled according to the terms of that contract.

In witness whereof I hereby set my hand and seal this 11th day of 8 mo. 1883.

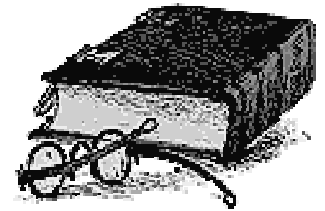

Contract Between William Peelle and Reuben B. Peelle referred to in the Last Will and Testament of said William Peelle deceased filed herein by said Reuben B. Peelle for Record and is in words and figures following to wit:



Contract made and entered into this the first day of March 1879 between William Peelle of the County of Clinton and State of Ohio of the first part and R. B. Peelle of the County and State aforesaid of the second part witnesseth that the part of the first part has this day rented his farm of 170 acres situate east of and adjoining the village of Bloomington in the county and state above mentioned to the party of the second part for a term of fifteen years beginning at the present date and ending March 1st 1894. On the following terms:

The party of the first part agrees to give up the management of the farm stock and fixtures to the party of the second part (except his residence and two acres of ground around it to be retained during his occupancy) to pay for all the hired help needed in carrying on the farm work to keep the farm buildings in repair to buy new farm implements when needed to furnish tile necessary for draining the farm to allow the party of the second part to keep four horses for use on the farm. To sell the party of the second part ten acres of the farm at sixty dollars \$60.00 per acre to be managed with the rest of the land during the continuance of this contract and paid for at the close of the same without interest and the remainder of the farm at the close of this contract at a price set upon it by three disinterested persons to be selected one by the party of the first part one by the party of the second part and those two to choose the third.

The party of the second part agrees to dedicate his whole time to the care and management of the farm to keep an exact account of the receipts and expenditures of the same to have a settlement with the party of the first part annually to care for two horses for said party of the first part and to leave on the farm at the close of this contract as many hogs as equal weight, as many head of other kinds of stock in as good order as those shown by the inventory of stock on the farm at present.

In consideration of these services the party of the first part agrees to allow the party of the second part one third of the gross receipts of the farm less the costs of repairing implements tax on stock and implements and cost of grain bought for seed or to be fed to stock on the farm.

Furthermore each of the parties to this contract is to have of the farm garden and orchard products such supplies as may be necessary for use on his own table and to supply himself with fuel from the woodland on the farm.

If at the close of this contract the stock on the farm has increased beyond the amount shown on the inventory the over plus is to be divided by the party of the first part taking two thirds and the party of the second part one third.

In witness whereof we have set our hands and seals this the first day of March 1879.

She then conceived of an idea to wear red poppies on Memorial Day in honor of those who died serving the nation during war. She was the first to wear one, and sold poppies to her friends and co-workers with the money going to benefit servicemen in need. Later a Madam Guerin from France was visiting the United States and learned of this new custom started by Ms. Michael and when she returned to France, made artificial red poppies to raise money for the war orphaned children and widowed women. This tradition spread to other countries. In 1948 the US Post Office honored Ms Michael for her role in founding the National Poppy Movement by issuing a red 3-cent postage stamp with her likeness on it.

Since the late 50's on the Thursday before Memorial Day, the 1,200 soldiers of the 3d U.S. Infantry place small American flags at each of the more than 260,000 gravestones at Arlington National Cemetery. They then patrol 24 hours a day during the weekend to ensure that each flag remains standing.

And, since 1998, on the Saturday before the observed day for Memorial Day, the Boys Scouts and Girl Scouts place a candle at each of approximately 15,300 gravesites of soldiers buried at Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park on Marye's Heights (**the Luminaria Program**).

The "*Memorial*" in **Memorial Day** has been ignored by too many of us who are beneficiaries of those who have given the ultimate sacrifice. Listed are some ways we could observe the day, as it should be, a day where we actively remember our ancestors, our family members, our loved ones, our neighbors, and our friends who have given the ultimate sacrifice:

- By visiting cemeteries and placing flags or flowers on the graves of our fallen heroes.
- By visiting memorials.
- By flying the US Flag at half-staff until noon.
- By flying the 'POW/MIA Flag' as well (Section 1082 of the 1998 Defense Authorization Act).
- By participating in a "*National Moment of Remembrance*": at 3 p.m. to pause and think upon the true meaning of the day, and for *Taps* to be played.
- By renewing a pledge to aid the widows, widowers, and orphans of our fallen dead, and to aid the disabled

Research Tips

LEGAL TRIVIA

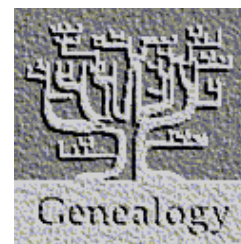
When land was sold, the spouse had to be listed in the land record. Land records should be searched after a death, as often a list of heirs will be shown during partition of the estate and even sometimes a map.

If there is a will, it is probated by an Executor. If there is no will, the estate is cared for by an Administrator appointed by the court.

FINDING MAIDEN NAMES:

In the lower left-hand corner of most deeds, you will find signatures of two to four witnesses. The first one is always from the husband's side. The next one is always from the wife's side. This is to protect her 1/3 dower right under the law. Nothing you will ever use will give greater clues to maiden names than witnesses to old deeds!

Also in the 1800's and before, it was traditional when the daughter got married, as part of her dowry, the father either covered the loan or carried the note for his son-in-law. If you know the husband's name but not the wife's maiden name and you can find out to whom they were making their mortgage payments, about 70% of the time it was her father.
